Suspect in Ten Armed Robberies Arrested

On February 5, after a pursuit, San Bernardino Police Officers apprehended an individual that was linked to ten armed robberies in the last three months. Violent Crimes Unit had been investigating the armed robbery series. Evidence linking the suspect to all ten robberies was found on his person or in his vehicle.

Thanks to the great work by officers of the San Bernardino Police Department, this suspect was arrested and booked on all 10 robberies.
