San Bernardino Awarded \$600,000 Parks Grant

California State Parks announced a \$605,321 award to San Bernardino as part of their "Outdoors for All" program. This competitive grant had 384 applicants from around the state and only 125 awards were made.

This funding will be used by Parks & Recreation for Conservation Education Workshops, Community Clean-ups, Camping Trips, Youth & Teen Weeklong Programs, Family Weekend Trips, Day Trips, Hiking, Beaches, Amusement Parks (Educational)

Special thanks to Trina Moore, Part Time Recreation Specialist who wrote and submitted the grant with an awesome dedication and passion for this project!




\$1.4 Million for Roosevelt Bowl Part of 2023 Federal Budget Request

Last week, Congressman Aguilar announced that the City of San Bernardino's request for \$1.4 million to renovate the Roosevelt Bowl was included in his 2023 budget request.

In addition, Aguilar also included two additional requests supported by the city – funding for CSUSB's launch of a physician assistant program and funding for 3rd Street road improvements near the San Bernardino Airport.

Funding for these projects are subject to their final inclusion when Congress passes a budget for the next fiscal year.

Business Registration, Police, and Code

Over the past several weeks, the City's Code Enforcement division, Business Registration division, and Police Department have conducted enforcement efforts aimed at eliminating non-permitted food vendors.



Since November 2021, the City has been holding monthly informational meetings with sidewalk vendors for them to learn how to operate in compliance.



Zero Tolerance Street Takeover Crackdown Continues





Another street racing /takeover enforcement was conducted on May 22. During the operation,11 vehicles were impounded, 13 citations were issued, and 13 arrests were made for both felony and misdemeanor violations.



Police Conduct Commercial Truck Inspection





On May 24, SBPD Officers conducted a Commercial Truck Inspection Checkpoint on W. Foothill Boulevard. Officers from multiple law enforcement agencies (Riverside Sheriff, Chino, Rialto, CHP) assisted in the inspection program.

In total, 81 inspections were performed, resulting in 17 citations and 1 impound.

Speicher Park Skate Park Outreach

Two meetings were held (one at San Gorgonio High School and one at Speicher Park) with students and local skate boarders to discuss potential components of the upgraded skate park. The turnout was strong and the response very positive to the preliminary concept drawings.
